Inclement Weather Information

If there is a county weather emergency, which closes county offices, the Senior Center will be closed.

At the HCSC we try to make sure that Meals-on-Wheels (MOW) are delivered as close as possible to the same time frame every day, however, if the roads happen to be more challenging, your driver may be running late. If MOW delivery is cancelled, participants are instructed to use their emergency meals.

Please ask a family member or neighbor to try to have your walkways/driveways cleared on snowy/icy days so that your meal deliverer will be able to bring your meal to you safely.

The Henry County Senior Center serves on average over 310 meals to home bound residents daily.

Qualifications to be on the Henry County Meals-On-Wheels Program:

- * Primarily homebound/Does not work outside of the home.
- * Agree to be home when the meals are delivered.
- * Unable or difficult to prepare your own meals.
- * Demonstrates limitations due to physical difficulties.
- * Shows medical necessity.
- * Henry County resident age 60 & over.
- * Agree to yearly assessments.

An initial assessments will be performed by HCSC staff prior to being enrolled in the Meals-On-Wheels program to verify qualifications. After the initial assessment, evaluations will be performed yearly.

5 Ways to Get Your Home Ready for Winter

Some people love the beauty and serenity of winter while others simply tolerate it until spring returns once more. Whatever your feelings about winter, the change of weather means it's time to prepare your home — or the home of a senior loved one — for the cooler days ahead. Here is a list of winterizing tasks to help you get started.

1. Shut off outdoor water faucets

No one wants to deal with the aftereffects of burst pipes during the coldest days of winter. That includes outdoor water faucets. Most homes have at least one or two. Take time to drain those pipes of standing water and turn off the tap before the first freeze arrives.

2. Have the furnace inspected

Having a furnace that works well is important for more than just heating the home. If your furnace has a crack or leak, it can put the entire household at risk for deadly carbon monoxide poisoning. Be sure to schedule the inspection before the temperature falls and you need to turn the furnace on.

3. Develop a snow removal plan

Shoveling snow can be dangerous for older adults, as can maneuvering on icy sidewalks and driveways. Before the first snow flies, have a solid plan in place for removing snow and salting walkways.

4. Stock up on basic supplies

Don't wait to head to the grocery store until your local meteorologist predicts an ice or snow storm. Stock up now. Have a stash of basic food supplies in your pantry and freezer, such as bottled water, canned goods, bread, peanut butter, and other non-perishables. Don't forget to keep extra pet food on hand, too.

Then there are safety supplies to organize in case of a winter emergency. Flashlights, a battery-operated cell phone charger, extra batteries, blankets, paper towels, and a battery-operated weather radio are a few suggestions. Also be mindful of your medication supply. Don't let them get too low before getting refills.

5. Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors

Smoke alarms can reduce your risk of dying in a fire by 50 percent. Any experienced firefighter can tell you story after story of injuries and fatalities in homes without a working smoke detector. The same is true for carbon monoxide detectors. These safety devices reduce the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Before winter weather arrives, check all these devices in your home and the home of your senior loved one's to make sure they work.
