The Henry County Senior Center and Henry County Transportation Network work hand-in-hand to ensure seniors in our community have access to safe, dependable transportation—whether it's to the Senior Center, a medical appointment, the grocery store, or other essential stops.

Thanks to community support, local levy funds, and generous donations, we're able to offer these rides to seniors at no cost to them. But as our senior population grows, so does the demand for these services—and so do the costs.

Currently, the Senior Center covers an average of \$30,000 per month in transportation expenses. These funds go directly toward helping our neighbors get where they need to go—safely, comfortably, and on time.

To give you an idea of what these trips cost the Senior Center:

- In-town trip Napoleon (one way): \$1.00
- In-county trip (one way): \$4.00
- Napoleon to Wauseon (20 miles round trip): \$57.60
- Napoleon to Defiance (36 miles round trip): \$103.68

...and so on, with longer trips costing more based on mileage.

These rides are provided through Henry County Transportation Network, which bills the Senior Center at a rate of **\$2.69 per mile**, reviewed quarterly.

If you currently ride with HCTN and feel moved to help cover the cost of your own trip, the **self-pay rate** is \$1.00 per mile for rides outside Henry County. Just let HCTN know you'd like to self-pay—every little bit makes a big difference.

More than anything, we want to ensure that seniors continue to have access to transportation that s upports their independence and well-being. Your donation—no matter the size—goes a long way in helping us keep that promise.

If you'd like to support transportation services for seniors, donations can be made by mail, online, given to your HCTN driver and noted as a donation, or in person at the Henry County Senior Center. If you have any questions, please feel free to stop by or give us a call. We're always happy to talk.

Together, we can keep Henry County seniors moving forward—one ride at a time.


