IMPORTANT INCLEMENT WEATHER INFORMATION



The Senior Center staff will determine the limits of service for days when road conditions are potentially dangerous. Information about the Senior Center, meals and transportation will be broadcast on WNDH-FM 103.1. If there is a county weather emergency, which closes county offices, the Senior Center will be closed.

At the HCSC we try to make sure that Meals-on Wheels are delivered as close as possible to the same time frame every day, however, if roads happen to be more challenging, your driver may be running late. If MOW delivery is cancelled, participants are instructed to use their emergency meal.

Please ask a family member or neighbor to try to have your walkways/driveways cleared on snowy/icy days so that your meal deliverer will be able to bring your meal to you safely.

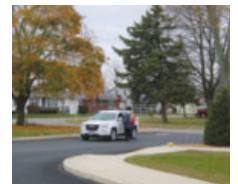

PLAN AND PREPARE FOR THE WINTER SEASON AHEAD



Power Outages: Know which items you need that rely on electricity. Plan for batteries and other alternative power sources to meet your needs when the power goes out. Determine whether your home phone will work in a power outage and how long the battery will last. Determine an alternate source of heat if your main heating source is not working.

Essential Food Items to Keep in your Pantry: Bottled Water, Canned Soups, Canned Meats, Canned Vegetables/Fruits, Granola/Protein Bars, Peanut Butter, Dried Fruit/Nuts, Snacks/Crackers, Juice, Coffee/Tea, Powdered Milk, Manual Can Opener

Essential Food Items to Stock in your Freezer: Pre-cooked Meat, Bread, Frozen Fruits/Vegetables, Leftover Meals. Frozen foods are great to keep on hand as they keep for a long time and can be easily used for a last minute meal. However, frozen foods can become unsafe to eat after an extensive power outage. Keep your refrigerator and freezer closed as much as possible during a power outage.

Essential Emergency Items: Blankets/Warm Clothing, Toilet Paper, Flashlights, Batteries, Matches, Cell Phone, Radio, First Aid Kit, Prescription Medication, Outdoor Grill/Propane Tank (to be used outside for cooking with proper ventilation, Generator/Gas (to be used outside with proper ventilation), Space Heater (safe for indoor use), Shovel/Rock Salt. It's a good idea to have supplies stocked for several days without heat, lights, hot water or even running water.

NEED HELP PAYING WINTER HEATING COSTS?

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) is a federally - funded program managed by the Ohio Department of Development (ODOD). It is designed to help income-eligible consumers with winter heating costs.

HEAP provides a credit once per winter season towards a household's primary heating source. Benefit amounts vary and are determined by the following criteria: Household income, Number of people in the home, Type of primary heating source, Disabled resident, 60 years of age or older, Federal funding levels & Geographic regions.

E-HEAP provides assistance to individuals who have received shut off notices, have less than 25% supply of bulk fuel, or need to establish a new fuel service.

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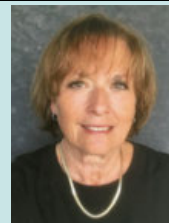
