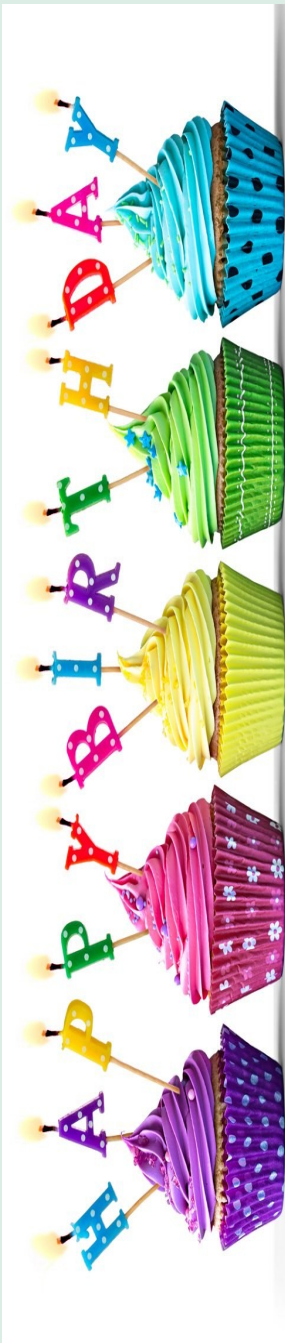

ALZHEIMER'S SUPPORT GROUP



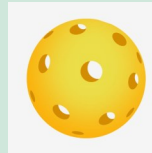

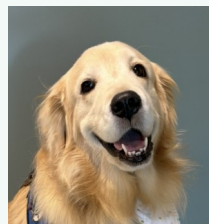

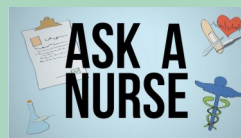
